Dear President Trump and Secretary Pompeo:

We are outraged over reports that the Administration intends to cut refugee admissions to 15,000 for Fiscal Year 2021 after failing to fulfill its statutory obligation to consult with Congress by September 30<sup>th</sup>. This decision is unconscionable in a world where nearly one person is forcibly displaced from their home every two seconds. We call on you to reverse your decision and increase the Presidential Determination to at least 110,000 for FY 2021.

For several years now, the world has been grappling with the largest refugee crisis in recorded history. Over 79 million people were displaced at the end of 2019, and 100 million people were newly displaced during the last decade.<sup>2</sup> Over twenty-six million of those displaced are refugees, around 40% of whom are children.<sup>3</sup> Throughout our nation's history, the U.S. has been a beacon of hope and sanctuary for those fleeing for their lives. Refugees are the most thoroughly vetted people who enter our borders, undergoing a strict, often multi-year, screening process, ensuring that they pose no national security threat to our communities.

Since enactment of the bipartisan Refugee Act of 1980, the average annual goal for refugee admissions has been 95,000. In Fiscal Year 2016, the U.S. resettled approximately 85,000 refugees, and the Presidential Determination for Fiscal Year 2017 was 110,000. During the worst refugee crisis in history, these resettlement numbers pale in comparison to the support our allies are providing and that our moral leadership commands. Since President Trump signed Executive Order 13769 in 2017, the number of refugees coming to the U.S. each month has sharply dropped. Australia, Norway, Canada, Sweden, and Finland all accept more refugees per capita than the United States. Failing to do our part to alleviate this crisis undermines our nation's leadership, diplomacy, foreign policy, and national security.

Your Administration's Fiscal Year 2020 Presidential Determination (PD) of 18,000 was already the lowest number ever set by the U.S. This comes after a previous record low of 30,000

for Fiscal Year 2019. These are gross failures of our country's moral and diplomatic leadership, scorned across the world. Cutting refugee admissions to 15,000 would mark yet another unprecedented abdication of leadership.

Your decision to cut the PD for Fiscal Year 2021 runs counter to the longstanding, bipartisan tradition of welcoming those in need of refuge. We reiterate our call for you to increase the Presidential Determination for Refugee Admissions to at least 110,000 without delay. Our future as a leader on the global stage depends on it.
