3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Advancing
5 Connectivity during the Coronavirus to Ensure Support
6 for Seniors Act" or the "ACCESS Act".

1**TITLE I—SUPPLEMENTAL**2**APPROPRIATIONS**

3 SEC. 101. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS.

4 The following sums are hereby appropriated, out of
5 any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
6 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, and for
7 other purposes, namely:

12 For an additional amount for the Telehealth Resource Center of the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy 13 14 of the Office for the Advancement of Telehealth, to pro-15 vide assistance with respect to technical, legal, regulatory 16 service delivery or other related barriers to the development of telehealth technologies for skilled nursing facilities 17 (as defined in section 1819 of the Social Security Act) and 18 19 nursing facilities (as defined in section 1919 of such Act), 20 \$50,000,000 to remain available through September 30, 21 2021.

TITLE II—INCREASED ACCESS TO TELEHEALTH SERVICES AND OTHER TECHNOLOGIES

4 SEC. 201. DEFINITIONS.

5 In this title:

6 (1) COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY
7 PERIOD.—The term "COVID-19 public health emer8 gency period" means the portion of the emergency
9 period defined in paragraph (1)(B) of section
10 1135(g) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
11 1320b-5(g)) beginning on or after the date of the
12 enactment of this Act.

(2) MEDICAID PROGRAM.—The term "Medicaid
program" means, with respect to a State, the State
program under title XIX of the Social Security Act
(42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.) (including any waiver or
demonstration under such title or under section
1115 of such Act (42 U.S.C. 1315) relating to such
title).

20 (3) MEDICARE.—The term "Medicare" means
21 the program of health insurance for the aged and
22 disabled established under title XVIII of the Social
23 Security Act.

24 (4) NURSING FACILITY.—The term "nursing25 facility" has the meaning given that term in section

1919(a) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1 2 1396r(a)). (5) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 3 4 the Secretary of Health and Human Services. 5 (6) SKILLED NURSING FACILITY.—The term "skilled nursing facility" has the meaning given that 6 7 term in section 1819(a) of the Social Security Act 8 (42 U.S.C. 1395i–3(a)). 9 (7) STATE.—The term "State" has the mean-10 ing given such term for purposes of title XIX of the 11 Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.). 12 SEC. 202. IDENTIFICATION OF BARRIERS TO NURSING FA-13 CILITIES ACCESSING TELEHEALTH SERVICES 14 UNDER MEDICARE AND MEDICAID DURING 15 THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY. 16 (a) CONGRESSIONAL BRIEFING.—Not later than 15 17 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall brief the congressional committees specified in sub-18 19 section (c) on options for immediately increasing access 20during the COVID-19 public health emergency period to 21 telehealth services for which payment is available under

22 Medicare for skilled nursing facilities and under Medicaid23 for nursing facilities. The briefing shall also include—

24 (1) information regarding the extent to which25 access to telehealth services is required for any fa-

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cilities that are temporarily designated during the
 COVID-19 public health emergency period as par ticipating providers under Medicare, Medicaid, or
 both, for purposes of furnishing skilled nursing serv ices or nursing facility services to individuals who
 are eligible for such services under Medicare or Med icaid; and

8 (2) recommendations for such administrative 9 and legislative actions, including with respect to 10 funding, as the Secretary determines are necessary. 11 (b) REPORT.—The Secretary shall submit a report to 12 the congressional committees specified in subsection (c) after the briefing required under subsection (a) occurs 13 that includes a summary of the briefing, any new or addi-14 15 tional information requested during such briefing, and such other information as the Secretary determines appro-16 17 priate.

(c) CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES SPECIFIED.—The
congressional committees specified in this subsection are
the following:

(1) The Committees on Energy and Commerce
and Ways and Means of the House of Representatives.

24 (2) The Committees on Finance, Health, Edu-25 cation, Labor, and Pensions, Commerce, Science,

and Transportation, and the Special Committee on
 Aging of the Senate.

3 SEC. 203. AUTHORITY TO AWARD GRANTS TO NURSING FA4 CILITIES FOR SUPPORTING VIRTUAL VISITS
5 DURING THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH
6 EMERGENCY.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall award grants
8 directly to skilled nursing facilities and nursing facilities
9 in accordance with this section to support virtual visits
10 by family members and other individuals for residents of
11 such facilities during the COVID–19 public health emer12 gency period.

(b) COORDINATION.—The Secretary shall coordinate
with the Federal Communications Commission to ensure
that all facilities awarded a grant under this section are
able to carry out the purposes described in subsection (d),
including through the provision of telecommunications and
broadband services necessary to support virtual visits described in subsection (a).

(c) APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS.—A facility seeking a grant under this section shall submit an application
to the Secretary at such time, in such form and manner,
and containing such information as the Secretary shall require.

(d) USE OF FUNDS.—A facility awarded a grant
 under this section may only use the funds for expenditures
 attributable to obtaining and using—

4 (1) technologies to support virtual visits de5 scribed in subsection (a); and

6 (2) any other items or services necessary to
7 carry out such visits.

8 (e) LIMITATIONS.—

9 (1) TERMINATION OF AUTHORITY.—The Sec10 retary shall not award any grants under this section
11 after the end of the COVID-19 public health emer12 gency period.

(2) SUPPLEMENT, NOT SUPPLANT.—Federal
funds paid to a skilled nursing facility or a nursing
facility pursuant to this section must be used to supplement, but not supplant, any other Federal, State,
or local funds available to the facility that may be
used for a purpose specified in subsection (d).

19 (f) GUIDANCE.—Not later than 15 days after the 20 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall issue 21 guidance on steps facilities awarded grants under this sec-22 tion shall take to ensure residents of such facilities have 23 access to virtual visitation during the COVID–19 public 24 health emergency period and how such access shall be fa-25 cilitated by such facilities. Such guidance shall include op-

tions for how such facilities will ensure notification of resi-1 2 dents and resident representatives of such virtual visitation access and facilitation, address how adequate support 3 4 will be provided to residents to facilitate virtual visitation, 5 address how facilities will ensure or enable installation and access to a device purchased for the use or benefit of indi-6 7 vidual or multiple facility residents, and address oper-8 ational issues and avoid unnecessary barriers to timely de-9 ployment of virtual visitation.

(g) REPORT.—Not later than 30 days after the end
of the COVID-19 public health emergency period, the Secretary shall submit a report to Congress on the grants
awarded under this section.

(h) APPROPRIATION.—There are appropriated to the
Secretary for fiscal year 2020, from any funds in the
Treasury not otherwise appropriated, such sums as are
necessary to carry out this section, to remain available
through the last day of the month following the month
in which the COVID–19 public health emergency period
ends.

21 TITLE III—MISCELLANEOUS

22 SEC. 301. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The amounts provided by this Actare designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to

section 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010
 (2 U.S.C. 933(g)).

3 (b) DESIGNATION IN SENATE.—In the Senate, this
4 Act is designated as an emergency requirement pursuant
5 to section 4112(a) of H. Con. Res. 71 (115th Congress),
6 the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year
7 2018.
