- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Franchisee Freedom
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PRIVATE RIGHT OF ACTION.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
- 8 sion of law, any person found to have committed any viola-

2	or section 3 of this Act, shall be liable to any person
3	harmed by such violation for—
4	(1) actual damages;
5	(2) additional equitable relief, including rescis-

9	(b) Jurisdiction and Venue.—Jurisdiction and

17	A franchisor may not, directly or indirectly, restrict
18	a franchisee from associating with other franchisees or
19	from participating in a trade association, including by re-
20	taliating against a franchisee for associating with other
21	franchisees or participating in a trade association.
